I smelled trouble, raised my eyebrow in fear and a tinge of curiosity. I told him I was not interested in watching their fight.


I walked away from him wondering what could have caused the thought of fighting amongst the boys. I really wanted to know.


Taiwo's father always told her that there is more to being a farmer. He has been a farmer since he was born in Abeile.
